THE COMMUNICATION OF CONTROVERSIAL IDEAS

It is the intent of this conference to provide you with information on how to communicate the kind of controversial ideas held by many admirers of Ayn Rand's writings. The classes deal primarily with methods of communication rather than content. Afterwards, you should be better able to successfully present your uncompromised ideas to an honest yet unsympathetic listener.

You cannot communicate any ideas unless your listener or reader actually hears you. For this they must first *want* to hear you. You don't have to convince them in a single short presentation but they do have to understand you. You will learn what barriers get in the way of this understanding. An interesting, pleasant presentation of your ideas is more apt to be repeatedly sought out or printed.

THE SPEAKERS

During their careers, some of the speakers have communicated Objectivist ideas through public media. They will present concrete examples of their successes and failures and the principles behind both results.

Two other speakers are professionally involved in evaluating the attempts of individuals like yourselves to present your ideas through public media.

The speakers are (in alphabetical order):

ANDREW BERNSTEIN Ph.D. Philosophy, is a teacher at Marymount College and will discuss examples of good and bad communication by characters in *THE FOUNTAINHEAD* (two sessions)

ELLEN KENNER Ph.D. Psychology, is a licensed clinical psychologist practicing in R.I. Her two topics will be: 1-examples of good and bad communication by characters in *ATLAS SHRUGGED* and 2-Overcoming the "Me-vs-You" barrier.

BRUCE NEWBURY is a talk show host on WPRO radio in Rhode Island. He will discuss effective techniques to use when calling in to a talk show and common mistakes made.

KEN WEST is president of the Association of Objectivist Businessmen and a professional speech coach and motivational speaker for pro-capitalist ideas. He will present two classes on making your case in public: 1-How to build a speech or letter (principles and techniques), and 2-How to deliver a speech so people will listen.

ROBERT WHITCOMB is an editor for the Providence Journal Bulletin newspaper. He will discuss how to prepare a letter to the editor in a manner most likely to result in acceptance for publication. Common mistakes will also be discussed.

PANEL DISCUSSION of several of the above speakers will summarize some principles common to all the above courses and answer questions from the audience.
